Opening remarks



Ms. Ewa Synowiec, Director, Africa, Caribbean and Pacific, Asia (II), Trade and Sustainable Development, Green Deal, DG TRADE, European Commission

Since 2006, Ms. Ewa Synowiec is a senior manager at the Directorate-General for Trade of the European Commission. As from July 2020, she is the director in charge of trade relations with countries of the Sub-Saharan Africa, Caribbean, Pacific (ACP), South and South East Asia, as well as trade and sustainable development and the Green Deal. In her previous director's functions, she was dealing with ACP countries, trade and sustainability aspects, agri-food trade, public procurement, intellectual property, bilateral trade relations with European (non-EU) and Central Asia countries. Before joining the European Commission, she worked for Polish public administration, including the function of Deputy Ambassador/Deputy Permanent Representative of Poland to the EU. She has PhD grade from the Warsaw School of Economics.

2008年より <u>IBCE</u>(在欧日系ビジネス協議会)の CSR 委員会の委員長として、会員企業がそれぞれの経験を共有し、日本と欧州における CSR/RBC の見解を橋渡しするプラットフォームとなるよう尽力。サステナブルファイナンス、非財務情報開示、デューディリジェンスの義務化などの重要課題について欧州政策担当者と意見交換をするだけでなく、ポジションペーパや提言を作成、また 2014年に発足した欧州委員会と経済産業省の政策対話「<u>日 EUCSR ワーキンググループ</u>」へのビジネス側の貢献として「<u>日 EUCSR ビジネス対話</u>」を提案、2016年から 2019年までの 3 年間、SDGs をテーマに日 EU双方から複数の産業団体との共同開催をリードするなど、積極的に在欧日系企業の視点を伝えている。

Ms. Yukako Kinoshita is the Chair of the CSR Committee of JBCE since 2008. In the role of Chair, she leads the Committee not only to bring the collective voice of JBCE to the European sustainability policy debate, but also strives to foster responsible business conducts among members by focusing on areas such as sustainable finance, non-financial information disclosure and sustainable corporate governance. She led the launch of the EU Japan Business CSR Dialogue and played a key role in organising annual meeting with other European and Japanese business associations between 2016 and 2019 under the framework of EU Japan CSR Working Group Meeting.

As a Senior Manager in Corporate Responsibility and EU Policy Research at Hitachi's Corporate Office Europe in Brussels, Ms. Kinoshita is responsible for CSR/RBC/ sustainability related EU policies. Her work also concentrates on contributing to Hitachi's global CSR activities such as drafting Hitachi Global Human Rights Policy and developing Hitachi Group activities in Europe such as embedding responsible supply chain management.

Ms. Madelaine Tuininga, Head of Unit, Multilateral Trade and Sustainable Development Policy, Green Deal, Conflict Minerals, DG TRADE, European Commission

Ms. Madelaine Tuininga holds a law degree from the University of Amsterdam and works for the Directorate-General for Trade of the European Commission since 1998.

Since 2016, she is Head of Unit in DG Trade responsible for trade and sustainable development. The unit covers a broad area of topics, including trade aspects of labour, climate and environment, development and human rights; as well as crosscutting topics such as the Sustainable Development Goals and corporate social responsibility/responsible business conduct. Activities include amongst others policy development, negotiations and implementation in relation to these areas through unilateral, bilateral and multilateral trade instruments.

Prior to that, she held management positions in trade defence investigations (2012-2015) and industrial sectors, raw materials, energy and market access (2007-2011). She was coordinator and market access negotiator for free trade agreements with Mexico, Chile and Mercosur (1998-2003) and for WTO accessions (Russia) (2004-2006).

Before joining the Commission (1995-1998), she worked at the Ministry of Economic Affairs in the Netherlands where she was policy officer for the US and Canada and for some WTO dossiers (intellectual property and government procurement).
